Shipping Notes. Brigantine on Fire.—The Kinara, McQuarrie, master, which arrived at Pictou on the 19th ult., from Honduras, reports having passed on the 27th August, in lat. 37 N., lon. 63 W., a brigantine, dismantled, on fire and abandoned, and nationally unknown.

THE STUDY OF FRENCH. The study of French has been abolished in the public schools of the city whose teachers are not qualified to give instruction in that language, the classes under Prof. McKenzie having been discontinued and his salary divided among a few of the other teachers. St. George Red Granite Company. Mr. Johnson, of St. George, N. B., the resident Director of the above Company, is in town. He reports the construction of the Company's works near St. George progressing satisfactorily. The Tramway (2 ft. 6 inch gauge) has been completed from the quarries to the Polishing Mills, a distance of three quarters of a mile. The foundations for these mills are laid, and the frame is nearly all raised. The design of the building is a hollow square, 150 feet across. One corner tower with two of the sides of the square (12 feet in length each) will be all that will be constructed now. A fifty horse-power engine and boiler, constructed by Messrs. Allan Bros. of this city, has been sent down to St. George, and will be put in position in a week or two. Fifteen of the columns for the new Post Office in this city have been quarried, two of them dressed, and four others are on the blocks. Several hundred tons of stone of various sizes have also been quarried, some of the blocks being 16 feet long, and as square as hewn timber. There have been for the last month forty men constantly employed on these works, and the development is being pushed on with all possible speed. A monumental order from Greenwood Cemetery, New York, has lately been received by the Company. The circulation of the Daily Tribune is rapidly increasing.
