

SIR PHILIP SIDNEY.

Sir Philip Sidney was perhaps the most extraordinary—certainly the most accomplished—man of the age in which he lived. He was a scholar, a poet, a soldier, and a statesman.

In the early part of his life, Sir Philip Sidney manifested powers of the most uncommon kind; and when placed under the charge of Dr. Thornton, at Christ Church, Oxford, gave indication of being possessed both of an intellect of the very highest order, and of a capability of acquiring knowledge.

Sidney's great literary work was his "Arcadia." It was written in the house, and chiefly in the presence of his sister, the Countess of Pembroke; and is therefore often called "The Countess of Pembroke's Arcadia."
