First returned to Ho. of Assem. 11 March, 1887, by acclamation, to fill vacancy caused by the member-elect, Mr. Ellis, resigning to become a candidate for the Commons. Supported the Blair Administration until May, 1889, when he resigned his seat with Mr. Stockton and went into opposition on the appointment of Solr. Gen. Ritchie as Police Magistrate of St. John, contrary to his recommendation. Was re-elected at the g.e. Jan. 1890. Is now an active opponent of the Blair Government. A Liberal.—*St. John, N.B.*

ANDERSON, JOHN. (*York.*)

S. of William Anderson who came from Dumfries, Scot., and settled in New Mary Land in 1819. B. at New Mary Land and ed. there. Is a lumberman and farmer. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1890; resigned and was re-elected Oct. 1890. A Liberal.—*Barony, N.B.*

ATKINSON, MARCUS CHAPPELL, M.D. (*Carleton.*)

Father's family came from Yorkshire, Eng. and settled at Sackville, N.B., about a century ago. Born at Baie Verte, N.B., 7 Jan., 1854. Ed. at Halifax, N.S. M., 2 May, 1882, Mary J. Stewart, of Antigonish, N.S. Is a practising physician and surgeon. Has been a County Councillor for Carleton since 1884. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1886, and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Bristol, N.B.*

BLAIR, Hon. ANDREW GEORGE. (*York.*)

Family of Scotch extraction. B. in Fredericton, N.B., 7 March, 1844. M., 31 Oct., 1866, Annie E., eldest dau. of George Thompson, Esq., Educational Department, Fredericton. Ed. at the Collegiate Sch., Fredericton. Called to the Bar, April, 1866. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e., 1878. Resigned seat on petition being filed against his return, and on the issue of a new writ was re-elected, 14 Nov., 1878. Re-elected at g.e., 1882. Called upon to form an administration, which he succeeded in doing, 3 March, 1883. Re-elected on his acceptance of office as Attorney-General, 24 March, 1883, and again at g.e., 1886. Re-elected at g.e., 1890, and again at bye-election held, 23 Oct., 1890. A Liberal.—*Fredericton, N.B.*
