I have to say that one hundred somes of that portion containing 140 agres in the land by a red line on the plan of survey had by Mr. Pish has been sold. It is, therefore, not possible to cut off from this portion a piece 40 chains deep, in accordance with your suggestion as this would reduce its area to 39 acres.

The depth which may be cut off in order to
leave the one hundred somes, sold is 26 chains 67 links.

Places inform me if the lands shown colored
red on the sketch herewith will be sufficient for the purpose required, and whether any one is in occupation of any
portion of these lands.
