Ottawa, 25th Aug., 1902.

Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 9th inst., and inclosure showing the land in Lots 3 and 5 North of the River in the Red Bank Reserve which the Indians desire to have reserved for a sugar bush, I have to say that one hundred acres of that portion containing 140 acres in Lot 3 shown surrounded by a red line on the plan of survey made by Mr. Fish has been sold. It is, therefore, not possible to cut off from this portion a piece 40 chains deep, in accordance with your suggestion as this would reduce its area to 30 acres.

The depth which may be cut off in order to leave the one hundred acres sold is 26 chains 67 links.

Please inform me if the lands shown colored red on the sketch herewith will be sufficient for the purpose required, and whether any one is in occupation of any portion of these lands.
