Dear Sir,

I beg leave to advise you that application has been made to this Department for the sale of the timber on McGregor Island, but before selling it I am directed by the Honourable, the Superintendent General, to say that it is desirable to obtain the consent of your Government. If this consent is obtained the timber will be put up by public competition and the proceeds of the sale will be held to be disposed of in accordance with the ultimate decision in regard to the title of the land. I am requested to say also that an early reply to this is desired.
