Ottawa, 26th June, 1915.

I beg to admowledge the receipt of your letter of the 31st ultimo with reference to the estate of the late Silas Logan and on behalf of David Logan, the halfbrother, who claims this estate.

In reply I beg to say that the Department has asked Mr. James to place Mr. Fox in possession of this estate until a distribution is made, unless he is gware of some reason why Mr. Fox should not have possession of the same.

Mr. Beattie of Highgate has written the Department claiming this estate for Keturah Logan, the widow of the late Joseph Logan. The Department has asked Mr. Beattie to procure from Keturah Logan a Seclaration stating whether she is the mother or only the stepmother of the late Silas Logan and also stating the names of the brothers and sisters and half-brothers and sisters. When this information is received the Department will be able to determine who is ertitled to share in the estate.
