3. Canadians Resident in the United States

(a) Canadians who are permanent legal residents of the United States and who visit Canada frequently.

Canadians who have occasion to visit Canada frequently should apply to the nearest office of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service for a border-identification card. If they receive such a card they will be given the same treatment as commuters (See paragraph 2, above). If they cannot secure such a card then they should follow the instructions given below (paragraphs 2 b and c).

(b) Canadians who are permanent legal residents of the United States and who visit Canada infrequently.

Canadians who have been lawfully admitted into the United States for permanent residence but who are not holders of border identification cards issued by the immigration authorities of the United States may either obtain a reentry permit from the United States immigration authorities before departing from the United States or apply for a new immigration visa at a United States consular establishment abroad.

Of the two courses of action the obtaining of a reentry permit is preferable. A reentry permit costs \$3.00. A new immigration visa costs \$10.00. Each of them is good for only one entry into the United States.

The form of application for a reentry permit (Form 631) together with instructions for its preparation may be obtained ~~at~~ from any office of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service.
