## Protestant Committee of the Council of Public Instruction.

## REPORT of Sub-Committee on the relation of the Pretestant Universities and Protestant Superior Schools to the Professions and Professional Examinations :--

Complaint is made that the Bar Act of the last session has infringed on the rights and privileges of the Protestant Minority in this Provinee, as regards Education. By that Act both the general system of education, regulated by the Protestant Committee of the Council of Public Instruction, and the general Course of Study followed in the Protestant Universities, (MeGill College and Bishop's College,) as well as the Special Law Course of these Institutions, have been interfered with, and are now endangered.

In order to attain to a clear understanding of the question raised, it will be as well to consider :---

1. What are the rights and privileges secured to the Protestant Minority by the Confederation Act (The British North American Act, 1867)?

2. In what respects have these rights and privileges been infringed upon or set aside ?

The following extract from the Confederation Act gives in full the clauses referring to Education :---

"Sec. 93. In and for each Province the Legislature may exclusively make laws in relation to education, subject and according to the following provisions :

1. Nothing in any such law shall prejudically affect any right or privilege with respect to denominational schools, which any class of persons have, by law, in the Province at the Union.

2. All the powers, privileges and duties of the Union, by law conferred and imposed in Upper Canada on the separate schools and schoool trustees of the Queen's Roman Catholic subjects, shall be and the same are hereby extended to the dissentient schools of the Queen's Protestant and Roman Catholic subjects in Quebec.

3. Where in any Province a system of separate or dissentient schools exists by law at the Union, or is thereafter established by the Legislat. So if the Province, an appeal shall lie to the Governor-General in Council from any act or decision of any Provincial Anthority affecting any right or privilege of the Protestant or Roman Catholic Minority of the Queen's subjects in relation to education.
