DUNHAM.

An incorporated village in the Township of Dunham, County of Missisquoi. Is beautifully situated in the centre of a rich farming country, two miles from the lovely sheet of water known as Selby Lake. It is a very quiet village and well suited as a summer resort. There are three churches here, the Methodist, Episcopalian and Roman Catholic. There are also the Dunham Ladies' College, an academy, an elementary school, also a dissentient school. Dunham has two daily mails from Montreal, one from Stanbridge Station via Bedford and Stanbridge East, arriving in Dunham at 1 o'clock p. m., and one by stage from Cowansville station arriving at 9 o'clock p. m. The mail for East Dunham, daily, and Beranger, semi-weekly, is made up here. There is a tannery, sash and door, carriage and cheese factory here, also a Commissioner's Court for the trial of small causes. Population 300. Distance from Cowansville, 6 miles; Frelighsburg, 6 miles; East Dunham, 3 miles; Stanbridge East, 6 miles; Bedford, 9 miles; Stanbridge Station, 12 miles.
