and after some Time spent therein, Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair, and Mr. Salter reported, that the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made some Amendments thereunto, and the faid Amendments being read, were agreed to by the House.

Reforted.

Ordered. That the faid Bill with the Amendments be ingroffed.

The Council acquainted the House by Message, that Message from the they had agreed to the Bill to explain and amend the feveral Acts of this Province, relating to the Affize of Bread, &c.

And also to the Bill for continuing the Duty of Excife on Wines and playing Cards.

The House then adjourned till To-morrow Morning 10 o'Clock.
