Ordered, That the report be now received, and the said amendments were then twice read by the Clerk.

The Honorable Mr. Allan moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Ross.

That the said amendments be now adopted.

Ordered, That the report be now received, and the said amendment being then twice read by the Clerk and the question of concurrence put thereon, it was agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Bossé, seconded by the Honorable Sir N. F. Belleau, it was

Ordercd, That the said Bill be read a third time at the next sitting of the House.
