TICHBORNE BRIDE IS THREATENED

MR. BALFOUR ON HAPPINESS

In Philosophical Vein at Opening of National Laboratory at Teddington.

Names that were on everybody's lips forty years ago cropped up in a strange case at Bow-street on Tuesday. A stylishly dressed young woman, giving the name of Teresa Mary Agnes Doughty Tichborne, forty-seven, of independent means, and living at Farnham Common, Bucks, was charged with sending a letter to the Earl of Granard, Master of the House threatening to murder Miss Denise Greville.

Miss Denise Greville, it may here be mentioned, was married on Wednesday, at Brompton Oratory, to Sir Joseph Doughty Tichborne, Bart., of Tichborne Park, Alresford, Hants. Miss Greville is the only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fulke Greville, of Elm Park Gardens, S. W.

The letter which the prisoner at Bow-street was charged with writing had reference to this wedding. It ran:

I have just seen the announcement of the approaching marriage of my cousin, Joseph Tichborne.

I have asked you many times to use your influence to make them give some of the money they have stolen from us, and you just hide and do nothing. It is nothing to you that I starve so long as you and your wife give parties, and flaunt about with people who, if they knew the truth, would be ashamed to know you.

Well, you cannot hide any more, for I am making you an accessory before the fact by telling you I am going to shoot that rascal rather than Joseph shall marry her and they shall live on my money, and as there is a God in Heaven I am going to do it. Now hide, and pretend to think I don't mean it.

Defendant: I said I was the daughter of Sir Roger Tichborne.

Sir George explained that Mr. Orton was the claimant to the Tichborne estates.

"VIRTUALLY A POLYGAMIST."

Indigation of New York Lady on Finding She is the Thirteenth Wife.

A novel matrimonial case is agitating New York at the moment.

Mrs. Ernestine May Daychart, who last year married Mr. Lionel Lawrence, is seeking a declaration of annulment. The case attracts the more attention that Mr. Lawrence is a great grandson of the naval captain whose name, "Don't give up your ship words," are inscribed in every American school history book.

The marriage was celebrated on August 13 last. Five months later Mrs. Lawrence declares she discovered that she was the thirteenth wife of the defendant. She gives the names of ten of her alleged wives, declaring that she married: Jessie Cunningham in San Francisco; in 1861 Dorothy Drew; in 1865, Leddy de Vynne; in 1866, a lady named Brinkhoff; in 1867, Jessie Barnes and Ernestine Kingston; and in subsequent years Lillian Bond, Carrie Rudolph, May Weldon, Reta Winfield and three others.

"I am bringing this suit," declared Mrs. Lawrence, "to exonerate myself in the eyes of the world. After we were married I read that he had been married five times and asked 'his family' about it. They said it was merely newspaper talk. I investigated the matter and found that I had been greatly humiliated in marrying a man who was virtually a polygamist. I am therefore suing for an annulment of the marriage."

Mr. Lawrence admits three of the marriages, but says he is totally unable to recall the other alleged alliances. He is fifty-five years of age and adopted a theatrical career after an injury to an eye had compelled him to leave the American Navy.

MRS. PANKHURST'S HEALTH

"Alone Refusible for Her Persistent Refusal to Take Food."

Mr. Jowett, Labor M.P. for West Bradford, asked the Home Secretary in the House of Commons on Thursday if he were aware that Mrs. Pankhurst was in a serious state of health owing to the treatment that she had received; and was the Government prepared to face her death should this treatment be continued?

Mr. McKenna said he had no information as to Mrs. Pankhurst's present state of health. If it was serious it was not owing to her treatment in prison by the prison officials, from whom she had received every possible care and consideration. Not only was she supplied with food, but every effort was made to induce her to take it. She alone was responsible for her persistent refusal to take food.

In reply to a further question, he said that when the licenses expired of the seven suffragists recently sentenced at the Old Bailey and since released, if they were in a good state of health, they would have to be brought back to prison.

RAILWAY CARTAGE

Railways of Canada have issued notice of cancellation of tariffs covering cartage points in Canada, effective October 1, 1913. On and after that date shippers and consignees will be expected to make their own arrangements for cartage. It is stated that this action on the part of the transportation companies is the result of the failure to renew existing contracts with the cartage companies at present prices, the latter claiming that owing to the increased cost of supplies, labor and other matters the performance of the service, they must have increased compensation. On the other hand, the railways contend that it is impossible to increase their burden of such extra expenses for the very reason given by the cartage companies, namely increased expenses.

The change in conditions at cartage points in Canada, it is pointed out is in line with practices which have long prevailed at U. S. cities, where the public are obliged to make their own arrangements with the cartage companies for deliveries to or from the railway terminal.
