Chicago, July 25.—Foreign musicians are to be placed under investigation by the American Federation of Musicians, because, it is said, they are engaged to labor in violation of the contract labor laws.

Mr. Darrow's argument, unfinished last night, turned into an appeal for labor as against capital, and a denunciation of all opposition to labor unions. He held an audience openmouthed as one after another of the sentiments poured from his lips.

His attack on Orchard was anticipated, but in this respect he surpassed all expectations.
