THAT FISHING QUESTION.

To the Editor of The Planet:

Sir,—In your issue of 21st inst. a letter from Mr. Wheeler pointing out, as he said, a few straight facts, now I ask for space in your columns to point out a few more. In your issue of 14th inst. it said Chatham and London sportsmen are up in arms over the shipment of fifty-three boxes of pickerel from this place. That report was false, and if such a shipment had been made, would it have looked as if our fish were decreasing, or would it have looked as if they were going to the spawning grounds at that season of the year, on or about March 14th. Mr. Wheeler says it is a shame to see our fine dresh fish that a kind Providence has provided for the people shipped to outside markets. Is not the fish from Lake St. Clair and River Thames first offered in the C nd an mrkets, and the fishermen offers them to the Canadian consumer at three to four cents per pound less than received from outside markets. If, as Mr. Wheeler To the Editor of The Planet:

consumer at three to four cents per pound less than received from outside markets. If, as Mr. Wheeler says, net fishing should and must be stopped, who would get the fish? Mr. Wheeler and a few more sporting friends like himself that can spend a day or two angling for pleasure, would they supply the market? No sir.

Would they come and fish through the cold snow and ice as the net fishermen have to? Oh, that would not be sport.

Again it is said the Government gave a definite promise to stop all net fishing. Why should such an unjust promise be given to gratify the whims of a few sporting anglers, as by stopping net fishing would mean the taking away of the livelihood of many. Was it not shown by our Minister of Fisheries last March at meeting in Toronto of deputation, that our fish had largely increased by our yearly returns. Common sense says there always was net fishing and still has to be to supply the demands of our country. What would our country be like if we were not allowed to ship our surplus beef, pork, grain, fruit, etc., to other nations. Now if I want fifty pounds of pork I have to go or send to the butcher shops for it. Mr. Wheeler won't come and ask me if I want it, and if he or others want fish they can have same from shipping point or Chatham market. It is a known fact that a catch of fish offered for sale on our market through want of purchasers only half or part would be sold; the balance brought home and through exposure spoiled. Now if Mr. Wheeler and his sporting friends had it all their way—but it would not do to let them—would they take our surplus? Again he says the people are not satisfied, with our present system of inspecting our fish. I say they are, Sir, and say we have a thorough and competent inspector at Jeannette's Oreek who lives a couple of hundred yards from the station and sees and examms all fish shipped.

Mr. Wheeler must have an object in these expressions, and think if the Government had such a one as him for inspector should ticket him "Paramount."

Now, Sir, we fishermen of the River Thames and Lake St. Clair firmly beffeve in the reteritors.

I do not include all sportsmen in my remarks, as I know several who believe in the old motto, 'live and let live,' and we have no doubt that when Mr. Wheeler gets through with the fish question he will be well posted on the game laws.
