Dawson, King's Printer, and Comptroller of Stationery for the Dominion, who has recently been honored with a C.M.G., is one of the best known and most honored of the public servants at the capital. He is a son of the late Rev. B. Dawson of the Reformed Episcopal Church. Born at Halifax on June 1, 1833, and educated at McCullough's school in that city, he early entered the book-selling and stationery business in connection with his father. Afterwards the firm became Dawson Bros. In 1879 Mr. Dawson aided in the founding of the Dominion Bank Note Company, and one year later of the Montreal News Company.
