

EDUCATIONAL NOTES.

THE BRUNNEN CANADIAN. The Brunswick School have given the Mechanical Institute the sum of \$25.

THE BOWMANVILLE PEOPLE want their High School raised to the rank of a College Institute.

DUNCAN McLEOD, M.D., formerly of Kippens, Ont., now of Detroit, has been appointed professor in Michigan College of Medicine.

REV. W. C. PINKHAM was re-elected to represent the Protestant section of the Board of Education in the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Toronto.

THE HON. MR. G. B. BROWN presented a few days ago a large portfolio from the Ontario Experimental Farm, Guelph, containing samples of grain and grass grown there during the season.

THE PORT PERRY PUBLIC SCHOOL Board have passed their annual resolution, viz., that all teachers shall be in their rooms fifteen minutes before the time for taking up school at morning and noon.

AT THE MEETING of the Township Council of Oro a communication from the Minister of Education was received.

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THE ENGLISH MAIL.

Interesting Summary of News.

THE "LIBERAL REACTION."

A correspondent who has analysed the whole of the returns of the recent municipal elections, as given in the Standard, writes as follows to the Standard:—The Liberals have altogether gained in 23 constituencies, but 15 of these constituencies are already represented by Liberals in Parliament, so that in 15 instances the gain would not benefit their party at the general election.

The Conservatives have gained in 13 constituencies, four of which only are now represented in Parliament by Conservatives, the remaining nine being now represented by Liberals, showing the Conservatives to have gained from the Liberals in nine constituencies. If these nine Conservative gains are deducted from the 13 Liberal gains, the net result is that the Liberals have obtained a net gain on the whole of England in five constituencies.

THE ATTITUDE OF THE BOERS. The attitude of the Boers towards the Transvaal which still remains under the influence of the Boers, is a matter of some interest. It is generally supposed that the Boers are likely to give the Transvaal some trouble before they will be satisfied to remain under the management of the Boers.

THE FETTERED BANQUET TO MR. GLADSTONE. Paragraphs have appeared concerning the proposed dinner to be given in London on the 29th of next month, and now a chief promoter of the dinner has published an explanation of the reasons why the dinner should be given.

THE AGITATION IN IRELAND.
