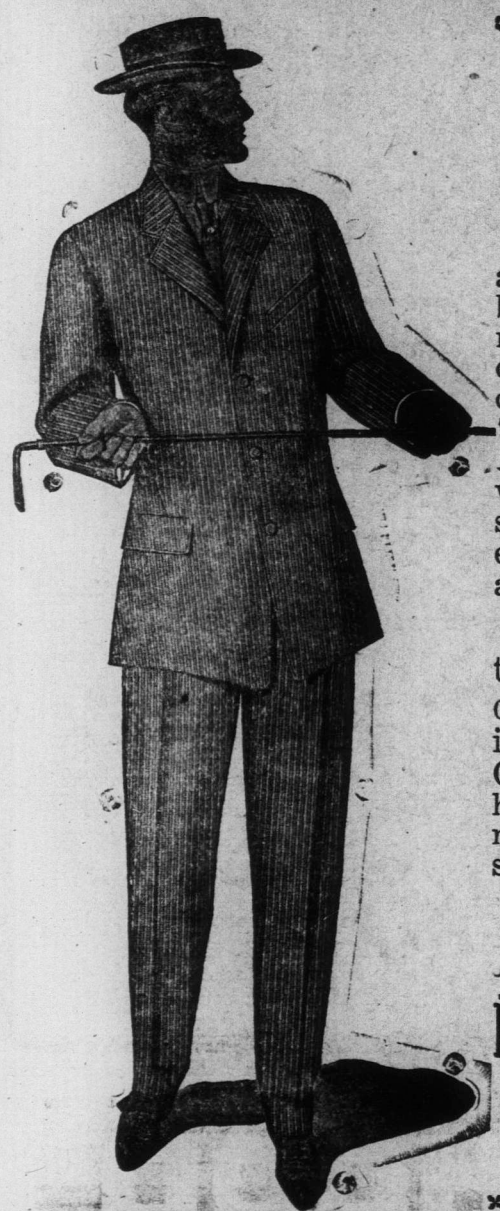

## Cable News.

Special to Evening Telegram.

MADRID, June 1.

General Aznar, chief of King Alfonso's Military Household, tells the following story: As the King was travelling by rail, and passing Utrera, yesterday, two little girls were playing on the track at a grade crossing. One was lying down, apparently asleep, when the train passed. The drivers did not see the children until it was too late to stop. King Alfonso looked from the window of his car to discover why the train was slowing down. Seeing one of the children being struck, he jumped from the window of the still moving train, ran backward and took the child in his arms where she died in a few minutes. The King was tremendously upset. The children were the daughters of the woman in charge of the grade crossing, who had forgotten that the royal train was due, and had not warned them. The King gave her a sum of money.

LONDON, June 1.

Belfast reports that the Ulster Army drilled and ready to resist Home Rule, now numbers 250,000 men, trained by army men and ex-army men in the use of modern rifles. They are practising daily with Morris tube rifles indoors, but only their chiefs know where the stores and weapons are accumulating or how they are coming.

MONTREAL, June 1.

Miss Cloutier is the second Friedmann patient to die in this city within a week. Before treatment, one lung was affected, but after the serum the other was attacked. Dr. Grenier of the Bruchesi Institute, says that Dr. Friedmann must now prove that his non-virulent bacilli do not become virulent after a time, as the death of the two patients would seem to indicate.

HAVANA, June 1.

It is probable that Cuba will shortly consent to arbitrating British, French and German claims aggregating \$7,000,000, arising from the revolutions of 1895 to 1898.

KOREA, June 1.

Twenty Koreans have been arrested, charged with a conspiracy with a view to the restoration of the independence of Korea.
