All the sailors and firemen, num ering twenty-six, members of the rew of the S. S. Cervona, now wrecked at Fanny's Point, Fermeuse, arrived in the city by special train on Saturday night. The steamer carried crew of thirty-eight all told, and the emaining twelve, who are the capain and officers, are still standing by the stranded vessel.


