Strong Assets for Jess Willard.

Here are five reasons suggested by Tex O' Rourke which give Willard an advantage over Jack Dempsey: First-While there are cases where little men have beaten big men. there has always been some reason. The big men in question have either lacked Willard's skill or his ability
