Hill, president of the Great Northern Railway, is their sole owner, having recently purchased 25,000 acres of the land on which the coal is located. He is now developing the property, and will, it is claimed, soon extend his railroad from Park Rapids to the coal fields, which are located in the country bounded by the Little Fork River, the Red Lake Indian reservation and the Rainy River in the extreme northern part of the State.
