News of More Massacres!

Many Missionaries and Converts Killed at Tai Yueu Fu. Japanese Alone to Occupy the Imperial Palace-An Attack From 30,000 Boxers Expected at Pekin-Famine at Tien Tsin Threatened.

London, Aug. 27.-The Shanghai correspondent of the Times, wiring Aug. 24, says: "Li Hung Chang has received a message from Pekin that the Japanese alone will occupy the imperial palace."

SIXTY-SEVEN MASSACRED. "Mr. Morgan, of the China Inland mission, who has arrived here from Si Ngan Fu, reports that 37 foreign missionaries and 50 converts have been massacred at Tai Yueu Fu."

THE IMPERIAL CITY. The imperial city is still invested, but has not yet been occupied. The allies, when the last report left, were still refraining from aggressive action pending instructions from their governments.

ATTACK FROM 30,000 BOXERS was anticipated, and to meet this the whole American force and the British artillery, according to a dispatch to the Morning Post from Pekin, dated Aug. 13, were moved to the outer city wall.

OUTSIDE PEKIN. Gen. Doward, in his report of the engagement outside Tien Tsin, Aug. 19, when the British, Americans and Japanese signally defeated a large force of Boxers, killing over 300, says, in a dispatch, dated Aug. 25, "The lines of communication near Tien Tsin are now free from danger."

CHINESE ATROCITIES. London, Aug. 25.-Further intelligence from Pekin shows that the fanatical hatred of the Chinese populace for the native Christians was in evidence to the last, everything belonging to the latter being utterly destroyed by the mob.

BITS OF CHINA. The Japanese have landed more blue-jackets at Amoy, where order is maintained in spite of the great excitement. The victory of Sze Chuen is reported at Shanghai to be sending troops to the Tonquin frontier, and to be intending to fight the French at Meng Tze.

LABOR MATTERS

Toronto Horseshoers on Strike-Hamilton Bakers May Go Out-C. P. R. Machinists Agree to Arbitration.

The C. P. R. machinists' committee at Winnipeg have agreed to arbitrate their differences with the company. The Toronto journeymen horseshoers, over 50 in number, representing 50 shops in the city, will go out on strike today (Monday). Nineteen men go to work as usual in nine shops that agree to the men's terms, but the other 60 men who are employed in union shops will go on strike.

The Hamilton bakers' union demands that the shops shall be union shops; that the foreman shall receive not less than \$12 a week of 60 hours and journeymen not less than \$10 a week; that the vote shall be one apprentice to three men; that the union label shall be stamped on every loaf of bread, etc. Some of the busses have signed an agreement to observe these rules, but others have not, and it is stated that a strike will take place in the shops that refuse to do so.

Saturday was the day set for the return of the demand for an increase of wages. Mr. McKenzie is still in the west, and the men are in not too good a humor over the long delay. A prominent member of the amalgamation of iron, steel and tin workers state that the vote now being taken by the various lodges on the proposition to vest discretionary power in the conference committee to negotiate a scale is thus far nearly unanimous for it, and that he expects to see the mills in operation in about a week.

There was another development in the case of the strike at the Hamilton Brass Foundry. Mr. T. J. Carroll, the manager, swore out warrants for the arrest of R. H. Hunt, Jas. Gray and Geo. Pope, on a charge of tampering and watching his premises-the same charge as that on which nine men were committed for trial Friday. The strikers, it is said, have secured other persons, strangers to the foundry, to intercept polishers who wish to come to work for the company. It is alleged that some of the stockholders in the company are getting uneasy, and are in favor of effecting a settlement, which Manager Carroll will not consider.

\$15,000 DAMAGES Awarded a Negro Band-Steamship Company Refused to Carry Them. Kansas City, Mo., Aug. 27. - The Kansas City Picaninny Band, made up of sixteen negro boys, went to Australia on a tour and was stranded there. They finally got money from home and bought tickets for Victoria, B. C., with stop-over privileges at Honolulu.

When they came to leave Honolulu the captain of the steamer on which they were to sail refused to take them because they were black. They sued the Canadian Australian Steamship Company for \$50,000 and their claim was compromised today for \$15,000.

The picaninny received \$25 each today as their share, so their Australian trip paid them fairly after all.
