Cloudburst Cause Flooding of City

[Canadian Press.] Mandan, N.D., June 27.—Mandan, located on the bed of what was once the channel of the Missouri River, is flooded, the business end of the city being waist deep in water, the result of a cloudburst in the hills ten miles northwest of the city. With the great mass of water flowing down the old abandoned river bed, with the Heart River flowing through to the city up to the top of its banks, and threatening to overflow, the city last night faced a most remarkable situation. Businessmen, clerks and shoppers who were in the downtown district when the flood of water rushed down the old river bed are marooned there, and will not be able to reach their homes till the flood recedes. There is no telephone communication with the rural district and it is feared great damage has been done to growing crops and farm buildings.
