The work of the Prisoners' Aid Association last month. During the month there were discharged from the Central Prison 75 prisoners, 42 more convictions, 42 more convictions, 38 Canadians, 12 English, 14 Americans, five Irish, four Scotch.

From the jail there were 127 discharged, 72 males and 55 females. Of these 25 were convicted for the first time, 102 more were re-convicted. There were 62 cases of drunkennes.

The Prisoners' Aid Association assisted after their discharge 25, from the Central Prison 18 and from the jail eight. The agent had 300 personal interviews.

At the Central Prison Night School (secular) was conducted four nights a week. The average attendance of juniors and seniors for last month was 81.
