

CORBETT AND JACKSON.

The Sioux City A. C. Articles signed by the Champion.

New York, Sept. 8.—Match-maker Ed. Lloyd of the Sioux City A. C. has his articles of agreement here for the proposed fight between Corbett and Jackson.

1. The contest shall take place under the auspices of the Sioux City A. C. on a day between May 15 and June 15, 1895, the exact date to be specified by the club before March 1, 1895.

2. The contest shall be governed by Marquis of Queensberry rules, five ounce gloves to be used.

3. The club agrees to pay the winner \$25,000 cash, to be placed in the hands of the referee, 24 hours before the contest begins.

4. The club deposits \$50,000 for the men's training expenses, and each shall receive \$25,000 in case the contest should be prevented by any occurrence other than the failure of either principal to appear.

5. The club requires from each contestant a deposit of \$5,000, to be placed in reputable hands to bind and guarantee their appearance in the ring.

6. The \$10,000 now on deposit in Chicago shall remain as a side bet, according to the stipulation of former articles.
