PRAYERS.

Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Heenan, moved,—That the Fourth Report of the Select Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce, on the reference as to the price of gasoline, be concurred in.

And a Debate arising thereon, the said Debate was, on motion of Mr. Young, adjourned.

Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Statement in regard to farm placements of families settled under the "back to the land" movement.

Mr. Cahan, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 7th March, 1932, for a Return showing:—

1. Whether the Government is aware that Mr. J. V. Guay, telegraph operator of Sept-Iles on the north shore of the St. Lawrence river, has been dismissed.

2. If so, whether complaints were lodged against him, and by whom.

3. The nature of these complaints.

4. Whether an inquiry was held previous to the dismissal of Mr. Guay.

5. If so, the name of the commissioner who held the inquiry.

6. The name of the person who replaced Mr. Guay.

7. Who recommended said person.

8. Whether said person passed the civil service examinations.

Also,—Return to an Order of the House of the 7th March, 1932, for a Return showing:—

1. Whether the Government is aware that Mr. J. M. Piuze, telegraph operator at St. Paul du Nord (Mille Vaches), in the county of Saguenay has been dismissed.

2. If so, whether complaints were lodged against him, and by whom.
