Canada's empire trade, that is our trade with all empire countries, including the United Kingdom, was as follows:

It would appear that Canada's domestic exports to the United Kingdom were \$35,001 more in 1934 than in 1930; but Canada's

total exports, including foreign produce, to the United Kingdom, were in fact less in 1934 than in 1930. This is only a fraction of Canada's British trade. Canada's domestic exports to other British countries were \$29,283,894 less for the same period. Canada's empire trade, including imports, in 1934 was \$114,375,846 less than in the last year of the Mackenzie King government.

What benefits have been derived from the Ottawa agreements? The results of the general policy of this government and the increased tariffs it has put into effect are contained in an official return made on February 4 by the Secretay of State. This document states that Canada's monthly imports and domestic exports from September 1, 1929, to August 31, 1934, were less than for each month from September 1, 1929, to August 31, 1930. Ever since this government has been in power the monthly figures for our trade, both imports and exports, show a decrease for the corresponding month in the last year of the Liberal government. I should like to quote some figures which give a comparison between the monthly imports and exports in 1934 and in 1930. Mention will have to be made of the last four months in 1929 because these were included in the figures of the last year of the Mackenzie King government. These figures are:
