Mr. Vanasse—On Monday next—Enquiry of Ministry—Whether it is the intention of the Government to import, from France or other Countries, or to admit free of duty, Tobacco Seed, in order to improve the cultivation of this plant in the Dominion of Canada?

Mr. Landry—On Monday next—Enquiry of Ministry—Whether it is the intention of the Government to cause an examination to be made by the Geological Commission of that part of the Province of Quebec, in which large quantities of Carburetted Hydrogen issue from fissures in the soil, and more particularly at Varennes, Louiseville and Yamachiche, and along the St. Maurice?

Mr. McCallum—On Monday next—Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Maritime Jurisdiction Act of 1877, and to repeal Chapter 40, of 42 Vict., intituled: 'An Act to amend the Maritime Jurisdiction Act of 1877."

Mr. Charlton—On Monday next—Order of the House for the names, date of appointment, annual salary or per diem pay, age and length of service, of all the Employés in the Clerk's and Sergeant at Arms' Departments; giving separately, those from each Province whose salaries are \$1,000 per annum or over.

Also, the names of those, if any, who, since the commencement of the present Parliament, have been appointed in the Departments, either of the Clerk or the Sergeant at Arms, upon permanent salaries, and the amount of the same, and any increase to salaries since the above date, and the names of the parties receiving

the same, and the Province from which they come.

Also, a full and detailed Report by the Clerk of the House, containing a specific Statement of the duties performed and services rendered by each Clerk in his Department (excepting the French Translators) during the Session and the Recess of Parliament, who receives an annual salary; also, stating whether any salaried Clerks were, upon February 17th, 1881, absent on leave of absence; and if so, for what cause.

Mr. Schultz—On Monday next-Enquiry of Ministry—Whether it is the intention of the Government to settle at an early date with parties whose lands have been expropriated at the Red River Crossing of the Canadian Pacific Railway?

Mr. Jones—On Monday next—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for all Correspondence with the Horse Guards or Military Authorities in England, with the Department of Militia or the Government of this Dominion, relating to the employment of Officers of Her Majesty's Service or of Pensioners in this Dominion.

Sir Leonard Tilley-On Monday next-That Government Business shall have precedence on Thursdays for the remainder of the Session.
