

to postpone, to refer, to amend, or to adjourn. These shall have precedence in the above order, and the first two shall be decided without debate.

Sect. 8.—After the decision of a question, any two brothers who voted in the majority, may, at the same meeting, move its reconsideration.

Sect. 9.—All questions of order shall be determined by the W. P., against whose decision any brother may appeal to the Division; and every such appeal shall be disposed of without debate.

ARTICLE XI.—FINES.

The following fines shall be exacted for violations of the preceding Bye-Laws.
