SQUARE FOOT BASIS BEST IN VALUATING PROPERTY

Is More Likely to Work Out Equitably Than in Appraisals Made by Frontage Foot Prices—Can Be no Rigid Rule Set Down, But a General Acceptance of the Square Foot Principle Would Leave Less Room For Inequalities.

It would seem to be about time that Toronto quit buying and selling perty on the front foot basis and got into the way of handling ground the more equitable square foot basis.

Front foot values extended along a block front are really the standard om which the square foot appraisal is made, so that frontage prices will always be a feature of realty trading. But the point is that too much stress s placed on that item of valuation and too little thought given to the area of the land under negotiation. In leasing space in buildings the square foot

of the land under negotiation. In leasing space in buildings the square foot foot lots are not twice as the basis for price.

Two hundred foot lots are not twice as valuable as 100 foot lots, that it in the ordinary practise. But there are people who will find that the last hundred feet of a 200 foot lot can be converted into just as profitable use as the front part. Restaurants, soda counter shops, for instance, are included. Other people will find a fifty foot lot just as valuable to their busices of the construction of a drill hall. There are several rules of percentage applied. They do not differ greatly, being founded on the averaged prices obtained in thousands of deals tabulated for the purpose. The table following is that used by the Chicago Board of Review, which is responsible for the final assessments in that city. It should be found valuable in giving some approximate idea of the worth of lots, varying from the average depth. People who sell very deep lots do not always get the price the greater area of their ground warrants, and sometimes the man with the shallow lot gets as much on the vendor of an average lot. 
