

This portion of the de-vice consists of a star-shaped wheel of wire gauze, so fixed that it revolves eparating frames placed at basement.

NVER. One of the largest roller mills in Min-nesota was reduced to a tangle of ma-ohinery and timber recently when its foundations were washed out by the rush of water following the breaking of the dam that impounded the water for sup-plying the mill with power. The mill was situated at the top of the steep bank of the river just below the dam. As the result of a period of high water the dam give way and the rush of water swept the narrow channel below, undefiniting the mill and topping the structure into the bed of the stream. The building and machinery are practically a total loss. Continuing down the stream the fush of water did additional damage amounting to about \$50,000, flooding hundreds of acres of land and tearing cur four brites.


