NEW SEPARATE SCHOOL ON RONCESVALLES AVE.

To Serve High Park District—Board Asks Thoro Investigation of Charges.

A new separate school to contain two class-rooms will be opened immediately on Roncesvalles avenue, near Westminster avenue, in a building rented for the purpose by the Toronto Board of Education. This school will serve the High Park district, in which there are about fifty small children who are at present unable to attend St. Helen's school because of the distance and the railroad tracks which intervene. Miss Teevin will be in charge of the school, and the adjoining hall will be used as a church. Mass will be celebrated there on Sunday by Rev. Father Minahan, and it is expected that it will eventually develop into a new parish.

Regarding the allegation made at the court of revision that names were obtained through false pretences as supporters of separate schools, the school management committee decided to ask to have the matter thoro investigated.

UNEMPLOYED GIRLS NEED PROTECTION

W. K. McNaught Suggests That Wealthy Families Provide Homes Thru Winter.

KEEP MINIMUM WAGE

Speakers at Toronto Industrial Committee Urge Policy of Confidence.

One more imperative need for an organization to provide employment was stressed by W. K. McNaught at the organizing meeting of Toronto's committee of the Provincial Industrial Association yesterday. He said: "One of the first things we must do is provide work for office and factory girls. Hundreds of these are now forced out of work. The situation is grave; unless these girls succeed in their constant efforts to secure work they must walk the streets. During these last few days hundreds of these young women have come to me asking for assistance in finding employment."

Mr. McNaught suggested that women with comfortable homes should help care for these young women during the winter; many would be glad to take domestic work; even if they did not work, all were deserving of aid. Many Toronto women could easily invite these girls to live with them for the winter. Humanity demanded that they be not allowed to fight this fight alone. They were alone in the city, many without friends.

Fatal to Reduce Minimum. During a desultory discussion Controller McCarthy and Mr. Atkinson made very clear their policy on the minimum wage at this crisis. "It would be almost fatal," stated the latter, "if suspicion were to circulate that the minimum wage would be reduced under present conditions. Class antagonism would be aroused. "With my consent no change of the minimum wage shall be used to break the new minimum wage. I am in favor of the minimum wage," said Controller McCarthy. Sentiment seemed to be in favor of restricting the committee's work to efficient management of the entire plan and dividing up relief work among the social service commission, etc.
