

CATTLE UNSOLD AT END OF DAY

Monday Crowding Not Conducive to Best Market Conditions

TRADE BECAME SLOW

Lower Values Obtained in Common and Medium Classes

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards since Saturday morning were 172 carloads, comprising 2657 cattle, 1488 hogs, 1202 sheep and lambs, 115 calves and 608 American horses en route to the British army in France.

Drovers are again getting into the habit of bringing the bulk of their stock to market on Monday, and making practically a one-day market for the week. It would be more conducive to the best interests of the trade if the business was so divided as to make at least four days per week, instead of crowding all into one day. There were fully one-third more cattle on sale than the demand called for, the consequence being that about half of the cattle were still unsold at the close of the market. Trade was slow, the market dull and lower for the common and medium classes, while the best were barely steady.

Stockers and feeders were slow sale at unchanged values.

For milkers and springers the trade was the same as it has been for many weeks.

The market for lambs was from one dealer to a dollar and half lower than last week and values for sheep were inclined to be easier also. The hog and calf market remained unchanged.
