vantages which make those hatreds sometimes to be considered as a political engine.

The fentiments I profess were always those of my heart; they were the basis of my conduct while I resided in the United States. I am perfectly convinced, that they will find their true value when they shall reach there, and will contribute to dissipate prejudices which unfortunate circumstances, or inimical arts may have scattered and somented, with respect to me, with men who testified for me an esteem, which I shall always sonsider it an honor to deserve.
