The Order for Morning Prayer.

The Service shall be the same with the usual Office for Holydays, except where it is in this Office otherwise appointed.

¶ Let him that ministereth read with a loud voice these Sentences of Scripture; and after them the Exhortation, Dearly Beloved Brethren, &c.

O the Lord our God belong mercies and forgivenesses, though we have rebelled against him: neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his laws, which he set before us.

In my trouble I will call upon the Lord, and complain unto my God. So shall he hear my voice out of his holy temple; my complaint shall come before him.

I Instead of the Venite, Exultemus.

EAR our Prayer, O God: and hide not Thyself from our Petition.

Take heed unto us and hear us: how we mourn in our Prayer and are vexed.

Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord, my strength: think no scorn of me, lest if Thou make as though Thou hearest not, I become like them that go down into the Pit.

Turn Thee, O Lord, and deliver my soul: O save me for Thy mercies sake.
