

SHIPS PASS ST. KITTS' DOOR CANNOT SHIP ANY FREIGHT

Public Meeting Will Press on Government Necessity of Turning Basin in Canal.

St. Catharines, Oct. 12.—(Special).—A largely attended meeting of the manufacturers, business men and citizens was held this evening to take action towards having a turning-basin and wharf built on the Welland Canal at St. Catharines.

A committee, consisting of Messrs. Notman, McGhie, Riordon, Jenckes, Burch, Briggs and Mayor Riddell, was appointed to act in conjunction with the city council and board of trade in pressing upon the government the great necessity of this work.

At a meeting of the board of trade evening the resignations of President R. H. Hamilton and Secretary John S. Campbell were received and accepted. Vice-President John C. Notman was elected president; W. B. Burgoyne, vice-president; and W. G. Argue, secretary, for the balance of the year.

A rather strange state of affairs was brought out at this meeting, when a prominent manufacturer, who was endorsed by others present made the statement that, although a large number of steamers passed up light thru the Welland Canal, it was impossible to ship freight from any point along the canal to upper lake ports, the steamers, when to get water, or Collingwood, Ontario, or to get water route.

A motion was passed, asking the co-operation of the different boards of trade evening the resignations of President R. H. Hamilton and Secretary John S. Campbell were received and accepted.
