REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS

One Hundred and Thirty Negligent Citizens Warned by City Clerk Littlejohn.

MORE WATERING CARTS TO-DAY

Only One Smallpox Case at Present in Toronto—Notes From the City Hall.

Out of 2300 births which have occurred in this city in four months, there are 130 not registered. The doctors, as required by law, send in a return of the birth, but the parents are in some cases negligent, to comply with the statute it is necessary that the birth of a child shall be formally registered, and City Clerk Littlejohn says he intends to see that the law is carried out. With this end in view, he has sent a circular letter to each doctor, pointing out the possible penalty of \$10 and costs, and enclosing a card which is supposed to be filled up and returned to him with full details. Ten days are allowed before proceedings will be instituted.

More Watering Carts.
The complaints of dust on the streets are decidedly numerous, and City Commissioner Jones has decided to put on the whole of the watering cart staff to-day. This will be carts and, in addition to the main streets, he will pay some attention to the macadamized roads which lead to them and which supply them with dust.

Quarantine to Be Raised.
The quarantine at St. West's Hospital will be raised on Wednesday night, Dr. Sheard thinks the patient taken from that place will be all right in about three weeks. The young woman taken from the Duchess-street house was released from the Swiss Cottage Hospital yesterday, and now there is only one case of smallpox in the city.

Board of Control.
The Board of Control will meet at 2 o'clock this afternoon for general business, and, with a hope that they may get some estimates from the City Treasurer. Mr. Fullerton's written opinion as to what action should be taken by the board in reference to the School Board estimates has not been received by the board, and they will likely have to wait for it until the Corporation Council returns from Ottawa.

Cold Storage Plant.
A representative of the English cold storage firm held a conference with Ald. Richardson and Ald. Lamb at the office of the former yesterday morning in reference to St. Lawrence Market. City Hall Notice.
The assessment of Ward One will be made known shortly. As there has been a steadily increasing value of property in the East End, the assessment will be higher, but not much. Ald. Curry is opposed to the proposition to give a 33-foot strip of land on the easterly boundary of High Park for the proposed extension of the Kew-Forest street, southward from Toronto Junction. He thinks the York County Loan Company should provide the thoroughfare for the benefit they will derive from it.

Owing to the delay in the extension of Duncan-street, the Telfer Manufacturing Company are anxious regarding water and sewer facilities in connection with their new factory, for which foundations have been laid on the Old Upper Canada College grounds. Arrangements of taxes must be paid to the City Treasurer not later than May 1, in order to save the statutory charge of 6 per cent.

New Prohibition Campaign Paper Will Be Edited By W. W. Buchanan.

TWENTY TEMPERANCE CANDIDATES

Number Likely to Be Doubled—Convention Called for Toronto Thursday Night.

A weekly prohibition campaign paper is to be started immediately, according to a statement made to The World by Rev. J. E. Stuart. He also states that in addition to the work of the Ontario Alliance a vigorous prohibition organization crusade has been inaugurated as the outcome of the conference of representatives of provincial temperance bodies just held at the W.C.T.U. headquarters. The campaign is being divided up on this basis for the provincial elections. W. W. Buchanan will edit the campaign paper, which will be published every next week. Mr. Buchanan will also address meetings on behalf of the W.C.T.U. at St. Catharines, Woodville, and other places. Mr. Buchanan will also act as business manager for the prohibition campaign paper.

Known Here Saturday.
The World asked R. F. Stuart of the Observatory concerning the report of the great damage by seismic disturbances in Guatemala and Mexico. The seismograph at the Observatory here on Friday night at 31 minutes past 9 o'clock, and lasted two hours and a half. The heaviest rumbling being at 10:20. The appearance of the ribbon indicated that the shock was of the Alaskan type of earthquake. The ribbon has not been removed since Saturday, hence there is no record of any disturbance since the big one Friday night. The newspaper did not notice the disturbance till Monday, but the sensitive little instrument "knew" to know what was going on in this half of the round globe.

The reputation which will wait upon the Board of Control this afternoon at 3:30 in regard to a plan for the improvement of the city will be introduced by Lieut.-Col. Platt, president of the Guild. The following citizens, who are much interested in this work, will be present to lay their views before the board: B. E. Walker, Wm. Macdonald, and J. W. Flavell. Delegates have also been appointed by many of the organizations in the city interested in this matter, amongst whom are: The Ontario Society of Artists, Canadian Institute, Public School Art League, Canada Architectural Association, and the Ontario Association of Architects and Board of Trade. The fact of so many societies and individuals taking an interest in this matter is evidence of a worthy ambition on the part of the citizens to improve the appearance and utility of the city.

No Location Fixed Yet.
Mr. Angstrom, managing director of the Bortman Engine Works Co., is in Ottawa, but it is not known where there was nothing in the report from Windsor that the company is considering the proposition to locate its new shipyard at Windsor any more than this. The company has received commitments for 12 or 15 locations enquiring concerning the shipyard, and has replied to all in the same way that the matter is being considered. The company has not decided on a location. The new industry will be for the building of large hulls for steamers. The engines will be made in Toronto.
