

DRY SPELL NOT DANGEROUS. Say Observatory Authorities .. Eastern Ontario is Suffering,

Some fears have been expressed thruout the province that the present dry spell will have a shrinking effect on the seed just sown, and that a light crop may be expected unless rain falls goon and in some quantities. Report from the eastern part of the provin show that for nearly a month rain has not fallen. The middle and the west have fared better. Rain is needed, and the weatherman hints that it is coming. Weatherman Says "Don't Worry." The average Torontonian is exhuming his garden hose from its winter quarters and is beginning his annual com-plaint of a superfluity of non-negotiable lust. Up in Queen's Park the staif of the meteorological observatory is reducing the citizens' kick to figures. So far this month this city has been blessed with two showers. On the 3rd one-quarter of an inch fell, and on the 7th one-tenth of an inch. Since April 15 there have been four showers in this neighborhood. In the early part of last month the rainfall was excessively heavy and brought the month's average above the usual. While dry here, the weather officials think there need be no agricultural alarm. 
