

Austin Cary, a well-known European forester, in a recent article in Forestry and Irrigation, makes mention of some interesting features of the methods of the Swiss forestry service. He takes in one instance, the Cannon Zurich, This cannon has a forest area of 116,000 acres, of which \$3 !-2 per cent. is owned by private parties, 4.5 per cent. by the canton, and the balance by towns and various quasi-public associations. The centon has a head forester, who acts in case of dispute, appeal, etc., and four assistant foresters, each of whom is responsible for all woods within certain districts under their care.
