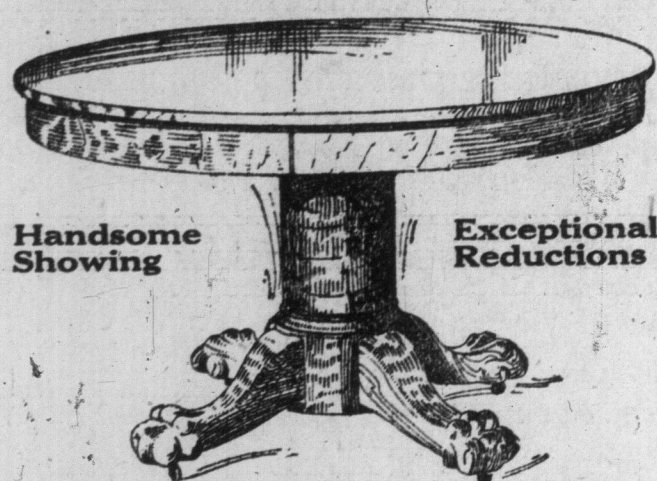

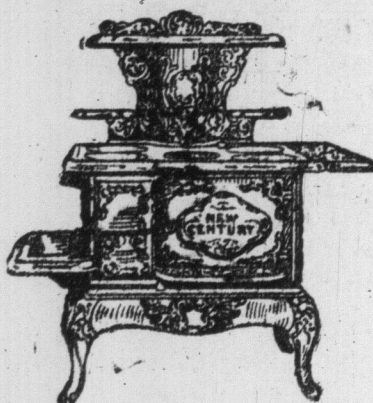

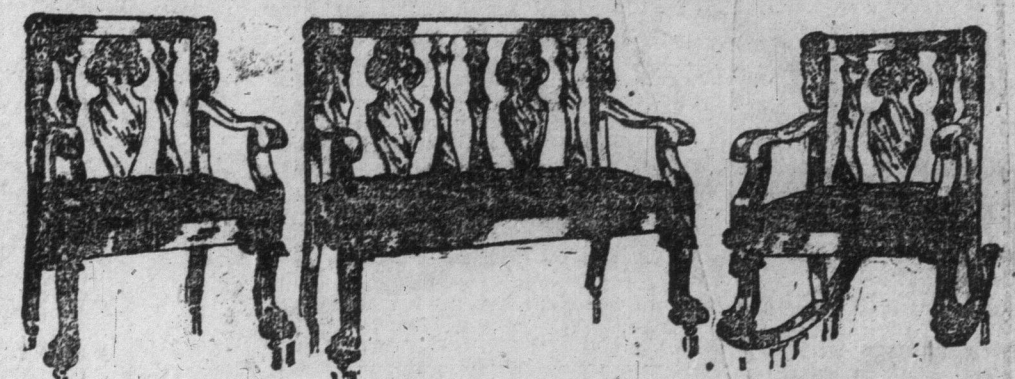

OIL MAGNATES DOING WELL

Value of Stocks Have Doubled and Trebled in Year.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Jan. 29.—The increase in the price of oil, which has increased 25 cents in the last year, without one cent more in the cost of production, is of itself enough of a factor to have increased the holdings of

the various companies several million dollars. Oil shares have entered upon a period of prosperity never before witnessed, prices in several cases having doubled and trebled in the past year. The oil stocks listed on the Los Angeles Exchange have gained in value during 1909 \$22,709,000.

The Western Pacific has finally let a contract for 2000 barrels a day to the Standard at 90 cents.

The Union Oil Company, acting as the selling agents for the Independent Agencies of Kern River and Coalings,

is reported to have made a contract with the Los Angeles Gas and Electric Company for fuel oil for its subsidiary plants. The contract calls for the delivery of 400,000 barrels in 1910, 600,000 barrels in 1911, 800,000 barrels in 1912 and 1,000,000 barrels in 1913, and the same quantity in 1914.

The Producers' Transportation Company's 100-mile pipe line from Coalings and McKittick to San Luis Bay is on its last lap, or a mile or so, and within a month's time the big oil steamers should be loadings for all parts of the world.

THE MORGAN PERIL

German Editor Says J. P. Morgan is World's Menace.

BERLIN, Jan. 29.—In his own weekly paper, "Roland von Berlin," Lee Leipziger, one of the foremost German writers, published an article under the caption "The Morgan Peril."

It reads in part as follows:

"From America, the land of unlimited

financial swindles and over-speculation, there arises a menace to the world. This danger is J. Pierpont Morgan.

"The financial ambitions of this one man who strives to control the entire capital of America constitute a most terrible danger to the civilized world.

"His unscrupulous love of riches and his fanatical craze for power have made his financial edifice outwardly imposing, but its foundation is rotten.

"Its collapse may ruin millions of men and destroy many fortunes."

RECORD YEAR FOR BUTTE

Copper production in the Butte district in 1909 has exceeded that of any previous year in the history of the camp, according to the figures made by an officer of the Amalgamated Copper Co. The production, he estimated, considerably exceeds 200,000,000 lbs. But for the December curtailment, due to the strike of railroad switchmen, the output would have been close to 220,000,000 lbs.

The year will also establish a record

in development work, especially for the Amalgamated companies and the North Butte and Butte Coalition companies. The amount of money spent for development and betterments during the past 12 months has been unprecedented, and it comes from a reliable authority that plans for the future by the Amalgamated call for the expenditure of \$2,000,000 more. This will largely go into changes for greater economies at the mines and smelters, which will include a complete electrical power installation at the mines.
