**Notice to the Citizens!**  
A LAW to impose a Tax on Dogs in this City passed the Common Council on Wednesday last, and in pursuance of an order of the Board, I hereby give notice that from and after the fifteenth day of August next, no person will be permitted to keep any dog within this City until the owner or keeper thereof shall have paid to the Mayor the sum of Five Shillings for a License to do so; and the person so obtaining a License will be required to have the first letter of his Christian name, and his Surname at length, and number of said License, plainly and legibly marked on a collar to be kept about the neck of the Dog intended to be Licensed.
