Ramsay Macdonald, M. P., secretary of the British Parliamentary Labor party, has returned from a tour of investigation in Germany. Mr. Macdonald was not a member of the official Labor delegation which went to Germany but met his colleagues there on an account of an interview in which Mr. Macdonald described his tour, which has brought him into contact with the central industrial organizations, both governmental and trade unionist, with leaders like Legien, the secretary of the German Federation of Labor Unions, and the secretary of the Social Democratic party, and with business men having commercial connections all over Germany, and so on.
