

TO ASK BIDS FOR WEST END HALL

Plans Submitted Do Not Include Estimate of Cost

Question of Bond Issue—Rebates Granted in Two Tax Matters

The City Council yesterday authorized a call for tenders for the restoration of the Carleton city hall on plans and specifications prepared by H. Claire Mott. The plans submitted to the council yesterday did not go into details as to what use would be made of the second floor nor was there any estimate of cost submitted.

Commissioner Frink pointed out that the work would call for a good sized bond issue and, before a bond could be authorized, there must be submitted an estimate of the cost of the work. He had discussed the matter with Mayor Potts and found that His Worship was not disposed to vote for any large bond issue for this work at the present time.

PLANS EXHIBITED.

Mr. Mott, who was present, exhibited the plans he had prepared. These call for a two storey and basement building with a hip roof. In the basement is provided a police guard room and cell, storage for the water and sewerage department and the heating plant.

On the ground floor there will be an auditorium capable of seating between 400 and 500 people, a number of rooms which can be used for various purposes and a kitchen and serving room in connection with the auditorium. The second floor layout had not yet been decided upon.

In order to strengthen the walls it had been decided to run a brick wall through the centre of the building.

The motion to authorize the call for tenders passed.

REBATES GRANTED.

The chairman of the Board of Assessors recommended that a rebate of \$86.88 be made to Mrs. Edith Skinner and a rebate of \$77.50 to the Tip Top Tailors, on their 1925 assessment. The recommendation was ordered carried out.

The appeal of T. L. Morrissey and C. O. D. Oddy from the valuation of their property, Prince William street, was referred to the acting mayor to arrange for a hearing.

A communication from the C. N. R. asking when the berth at the potato shed would be ready for use was referred to Commissioner Bullock. The commissioner said he expected the berth would be ready in a day or two.

A letter from Belyea and Gilbert asking what disposition had been made of the appeal of the Imperial Oil Company against the assessment on the oil in the tanker "Sarnolite" was referred to the acting mayor for a report.

On motion of Commissioner Bullock the agreement with the Merchants' Advertising and Publishing Co. for the advertising privileges in the ferry, was renewed for one year from February 1, next.
