New York, Feb. 11.—An American record of 81.4 seconds for the 70-yard low hurdles was made by E. J. Thompson of Dartmouth College in Madison Square Garden last night. He also won the 70 yards high hurdles event.

Carpentier to Tour States.

Paris, Feb. 11.—Georges Carpentier will be seen in action in the United States before he meets Jack Dempsey. Carpentier's manager has signed a contract calling for a ten weeks' appearance of the Frenchman in the United States. Carpentier and his trainer will give sparring exhibitions, with the trainer playing the part of Beckett, of the fight in London last December.

The French fighter, according to the terms of the contract, will receive something more than 1,000,000 francs for his American tour. Passage has been booked for America for about the middle of March.

McDonald to Meet Brousseau.

Montreal, Feb. 10.—Eugene Brousseau of this city has signed articles to box Roddie McDonald of Glace Bay fifteen rounds at Halifax on March 2 for the middleweight championship of Canada. The bout will be staged by the Great War Veterans' Association at Halifax.

Pete Herman Wins.

St. Louis, Feb. 10.—Pete Herman, a heavyweight champion, won a newspaper decision over Johnny Goodberg of Brooklyn in an eight-round bout here tonight. Herman was given the advantage in six of the rounds.

SKATING.

McLean Makes Excuse.

Christiana, Feb. 11.—The newspapers explode an alibi urged by Robert McLean, Chicago skater, for failing to win the 1000 metre race on Sunday against Oscar Mathieson of Christiania. They deny that there was an incorrect signal at the curve, leading McLean to take the wrong course, as he alleges. McLean says he is waiting for the moving pictures to prove that he is right.

FAVOR UNION OF CHURCHES.
At Philadelphia last week the plan of the ad interim committee for the union of all the evangelical churches in the United States was before the Inter-Church Council on Organic Union. The plan, with certain portions and a number of amendments referred to the committee on plan, was tentatively adopted. Virtually all of the delegates, it was stated, agree that organic union is desirable, but differ as to the method by which it should be brought about. About thirty denominations are represented at the conference.
