WINTER PORT IS LOSING A GOOD OFFICIAL. Mr. Bienerhassett Will Leave Next Month for New Position in Montreal to Which He Has Been Promoted. Bienerhassett, in charge of the foreign freight department at Sand Point, who has been promoted to take charge of the C. P. R.'s import and export business at the port of Montreal, will leave to take up his new duties during the latter part of next month.

SAYS CAMPBELL WAS INJURED BUT WAS SOME SHAMMING. Evidence in Case Against Donaldson Bros. is Concluded and Judgment Reserved. The case of Robert Campbell vs. Donaldson Bros., which was commenced yesterday morning before Mr. Justice McKewen, was continued in the afternoon in the Admiralty Chambers. The plaintiff was injured on November 23, while working on the steamship "Almora." He claims \$10,000 damages. At the afternoon session Dr. Baxter and H. C. Schofield gave evidence. This concluded the case for the plaintiff.

H. H. PICKETT IN EVANS WILL CASE. Appointed by United States Court to Take Deposition of Heirs of Wealthy Boston Man. A Boston special despatch to the Times says:—H. H. Pickett, of St. John, was one of those appointed by the supreme court today to take depositions of the heirs at law of Robert D. Evans, millionaire, who was a native of St. John county. The testimony will be used to safeguard the property should a contest arise after the death of Mrs. Evans, who is childless. Several of the cousins live in the vicinity of St. John.

MARRIED SUSSEX GIRL. Herbert J. Strothard Leaves Bride of Two Months to go to Court on Forgery Charge. (Canadian Press) Cambridge, Mass., Feb. 7.—Wanted on the charge of the forgery of checks amounting to \$700, Herbert J. Strothard, with various aliases, was arrested in Cambridge last night by United States Marshal Ruhl and a Canadian detective for the dominion authorities. Strothard hails from Beauséjour and went from Worcester to Halifax last December to become a commercial traveller for Gunn & Co., four merchants. It is charged that he passed small checks on various banks and hotels in Nova Scotia, made out in the names of Halifax merchants.
