WORLD-COAL TURNING RECORD AT BRODSWORTH
MAIN PIT
London, March 5—(By mail)—What is claimed as the world's coal-turning record has been achieved at Brodsworth main pit, Doncaster, says the Doncaster correspondent of The London Daily News. In six hours forty minutes' winding last week 2,920 tons were drawn. In the two following shifts of thirteen hours twenty minutes' winding, 5,600 tons were turned. Brodsworth pit is Doncaster's oldest colliery. It was sunk fifteen years ago. During the last two years great developments have taken place, shafts being sunk to a seam below the Barnsley bed, which is the chief source of supply. Preparations are in hand for sinking an additional shaft to simplify drawing operations.

Wrong Doing In Society Life In Washington

Petition That Grand Jury Investigate Charges of Gambling and Drinking Affairs.
Spokane, April 8.—Petitions asking federal grand jury investigation of statements of alleged misconduct in Washington, D. C., society circles will be circulated at once in prominent Pacific coast cities, so it is announced by H. C. Harris, chairman of a citizens committee arranging for the petitions.
