ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, TORONTO.

Two and a-half miles west from the City hall, on Queen street. The property is vested in the Crown. Government appoints medical superintendent, bursar and inspector. The latter frames by-laws for its government, and thoroughly examines the asylum, and reports to the Lieut.-Governor. The admission of patients is regulated by cap. 31, 36 Victoria, statutes of Ontario, which requires that the patient be examined separately and apart by three licensed medical practitioners, who certify to the insanity. Application for admission must be made before sending lunatics.
