It is unlikely that/kemkemxxil drew any temperance votes from those not conservatives. Foote the U.F.O. candidate is supposed to have cut into both sides about equally, but my personal view is that he did more harm to Walton than to Lennox but I can form a better opinion on this point when I I will then analyse it see the vote by polling subdivisions.
