

## CHARGE SHEET

The Accused, Major S.R. MITCHELL, of the Canadian Dental Corps, attached to the Saskatoon Light Infantry (MG) Canadian Army Overseas, is charged with:-

First Charge  
A.A. Sec. 40

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he did issue and negotiate with the Field Cashier 1 Cdn Div, on or about 6 Jun 42, a cheque in the sum of £30-0-0 which was subsequently dishonoured, having no reasonable grounds to suppose that this cheque would be honoured on presentation.

Second Charge

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he did issue and negotiate with the Park Lane Hotel, London, on or about 4 JUL 42, a cheque in the sum of £4-0-0 which was subsequently dishonoured, having no reasonable grounds to suppose that this cheque would be honoured on presentation.

Third Charge

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he did issue and negotiate with the Park Lane Hotel, London, on or about 4 JUL 42, a cheque in the sum of £7/15/7 which was subsequently dishonoured, having no reasonable grounds to suppose that this cheque would be honoured on presentation.

Fourth Charge

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he did issue and negotiate with the Unit Paymaster of the Saskatoon Light Infantry on or about 3 AUG 42 a cheque in the sum of £4-0-0 which was subsequently dishonoured, having no reasonable grounds to suppose that this cheque would be honoured on presentation.

Fifth Charge

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he did borrow money on or about the 25th May 1942 from a subordinate, namely the sum of One Pound from C-97000 Sgt. Carpenter, T.S. NO. 1 C.D.C.

Sixth Charge

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he did borrow money, namely 10 Shillings from a subordinate, while said subordinate, H.-19445 Pte. Mykes, J., was acting as his batman. (Lorne Scots Coy. No. 1 C.S.R.U.)

Seventh Charge

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE CONDUCT TO THE PREJUDICE OF GOOD ORDER AND MILITARY DISCIPLINE, in that he neglected to reimburse H-19445 Pte. Mykes, J. of Lorne Scots Coy., No. 1 C.S.R.U. for services performed by the said Pte. Mykes, namely pressing and laundry to the amount of 14 Shillings.
