

MR. JUSTICE DUFF FOR SUPREME COURT British Columbia Representative Appointed Member of Highest Tribunal of Canada

Mr. Justice Duff, who since February, 1904, has been a member of the Supreme Court Bench of British Columbia, has accepted the vacancy on the Supreme Court of Canada. He will leave Victoria on Wednesday morning for Ottawa in order to be sworn in time to be present at the sitting of the court on October 2nd.

During his college course Mr. Duff had among fellow classmates Chief Justice Hunter of the British Columbia court, and Stuart Henderson, M. P. In his law course he headed all his classes, and was called to the bar of Ontario in 1893.
